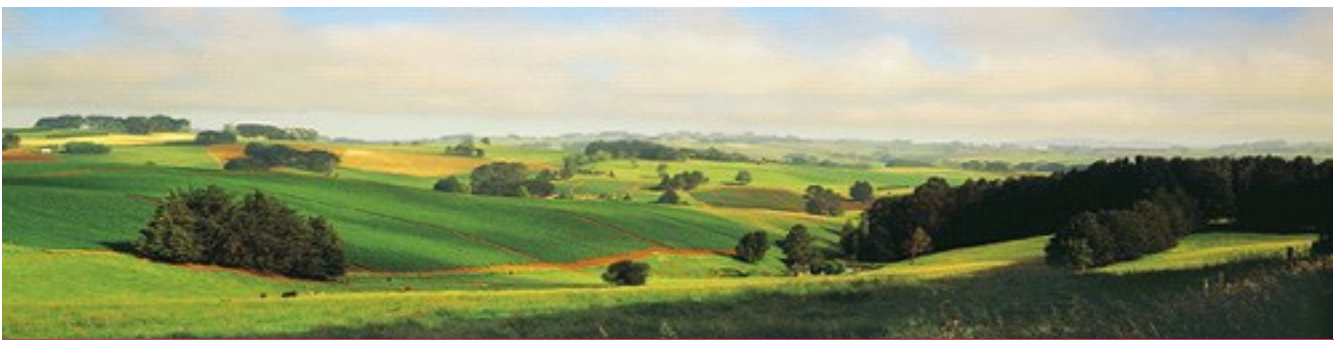

FATHER'S DAY PICNIC

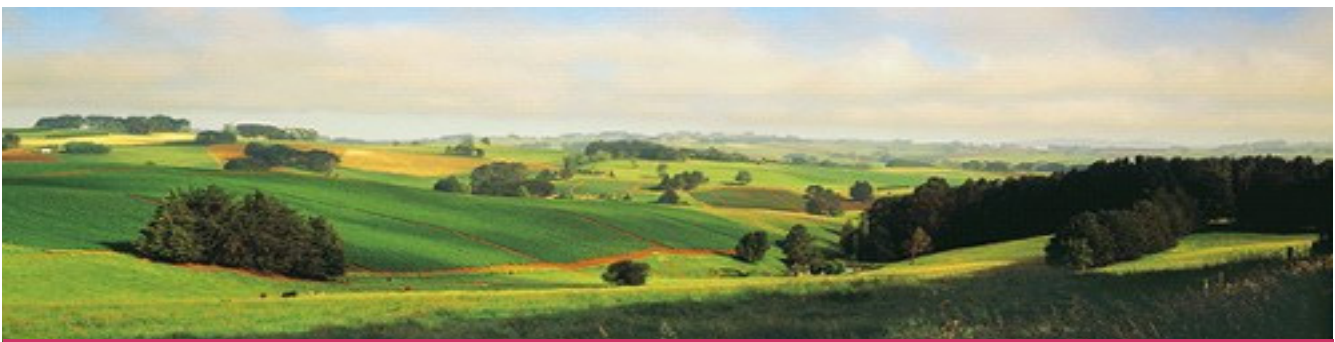

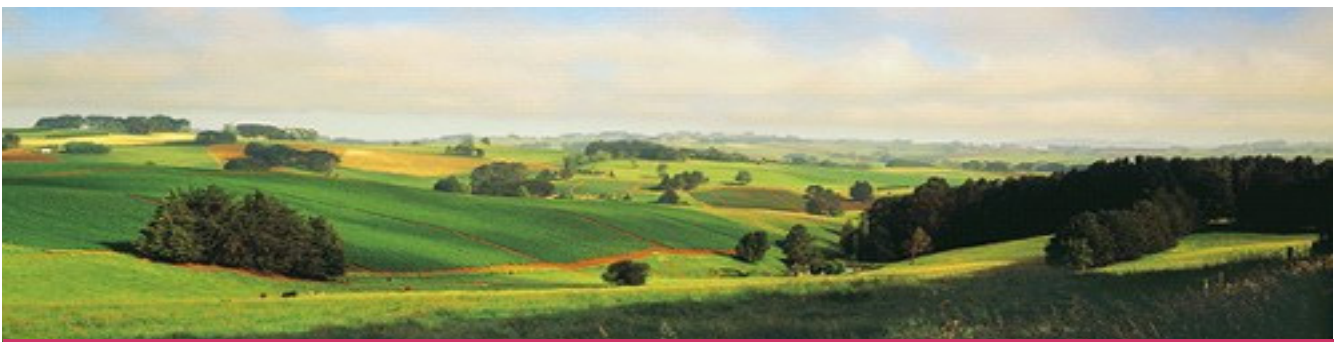

The focus of the Dairy Expo is milk harvesting and therefore the exhibitors that attend are dairy specific.

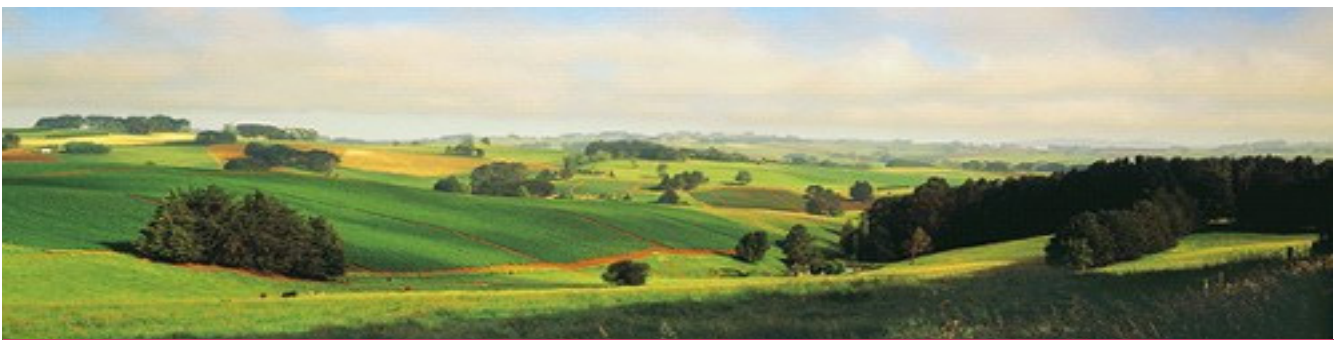

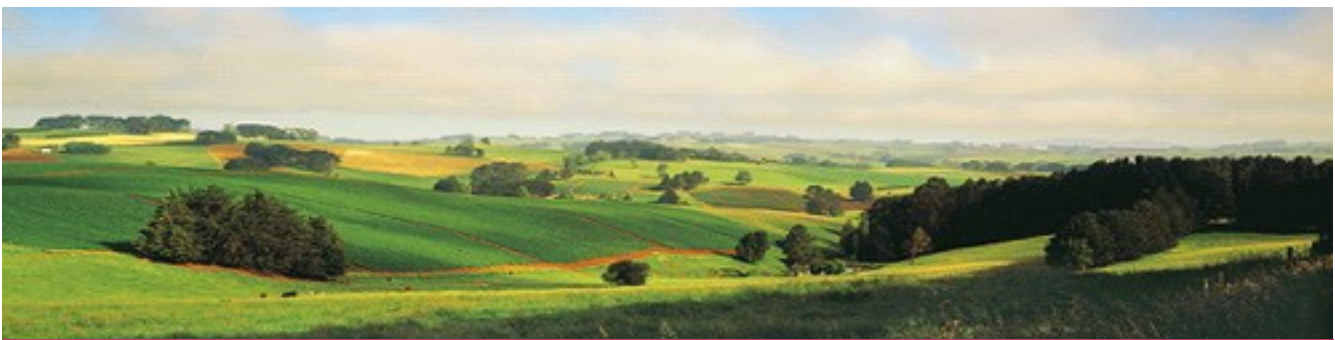
